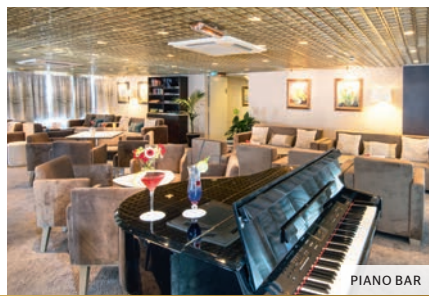

BARCELONA

Barcelona (morning)

We'll visit the Gothic Quarter and its narrow streets filled with trendy bars, nightclubs, and restaurants. Along our way, we'll pass two Gaudí designs, the Casa Batlló and Casa Milà buildings. The next stop will be La Boqueria Market for a taste of some Spanish cold cuts.

La Sagrada Família and the Park Güell (afternoon)

La Sagrada Família is Antoni Gaudí's magnum opus. The magnificent building has been under construction since 1882. Since the artist's death, work has resumed and the church can now be visited. Afterwards, we'll take a stroll through Park Güell, another Gaudí urban masterpiece, and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

ROSES

Roses and the Dalí Theater-Museum (morning)

We'll enjoy a tour that includes a walk through the old town to see Santa Maria Church and then up to the citadel. Within its walls, we find the ruins of an 11th-century monastery, a Roman town, a Greek quarter, a Paleochristian necropolis, and several 16th-century military structures. Our last stop will be the Dalí Theater-Museum, a wild Surrealist dream. Dalí was an eccentric, meticulous artist who changed the way we look at the world.

OR

Monastery of Sant Pere de Rodes (morning)

The Monastery of Sant Pere de Rodes sits high on a peak in the Sierra de Rodes. The majestic, elegant monastery is a colossal Romanesque-style structure. It served as a cloister for over ten centuries. The last monks abandoned it in the 20th century and left it for ruin before the government carefully restored it.

PALAMOS

Palamos Fishing Museum (afternoon)

Learn about the past, present, and future of fishing and its significant impact on the Costa Brava. Afterwards, we'll head to the magnificent Bodega Brugarol wine cellar. We'll visit the underground cellars built right below the vineyard with a wine tasting accompanied by cheeses and Spanish cold cuts.

TARRAGONA

Tarragona (morning)

Tarragona is a lively port city with a rich, Roman-infused past. We'll visit the fascinating ruins that include an amphitheater and Roman circus. The Middle Ages also left their mark on Tarragona. Some striking examples include the Tarragona Cathedral, the Diocesan Museum, the Old Santa Tecla Hospital, and the Jewish Quarter.

CARTAGENA

Cartagena (afternoon)

We'll tour the old part of town and see the exterior of the Roman theater discovered only in 1988. A panoramic elevator will bring you to the fortified Castillo de la Concepción, where you'll be able to take in the wonderful views before visiting the fort. The site originated as a Roman temple, evolved into a Moorish fort, and subsequently turned into a medieval citadel.

MALAGA

Malaga (afternoon)

The city where Pablo Picasso was born. Located at the mouth of the Guadalmedina river, Malaga is one of the oldest Mediterranean seaports. Dominated by its Moorish castle perched on the Mount of Gibralfaro, the city offers stunning scenery, a charming historic centre, tree-lined promenades, and excellent restaurants. We'll visit the Picasso Museum, which houses many of his original works.

Grenada (full day including lunch)

We will visit the Alhambra, whose translation from Arabic "The Red One" refers to the sun-dried bricks used to build the outer walls. Together with Córdoba's Mezquita, this true wonder of Moorish art stands as one of the most prestigious testimonies of the seven-century Muslim presence in Spain. Next, we'll visit the Palacio de Generalife, the former summer palace of the Nasrid rulers, and its marvellous gardens designed in the 14th century.

MONASTERY OF SANT PERE DE RODES

Magnificent Mudéjar Art From the Andalusian Flatlands to Morocco's Imperial Cities

Although the Strait of Gibraltar separates Spain and Morocco, they share a rich, common history.

Our trip will focus on Mudéjar art, a mix of styles that appeared between the Moorish invasions and the Spanish Reconquista. Join us on a fascinating cruise under the golden sunshine in Andalusia to the lively atmosphere of the traditional Moroccan bazaars known as souks.

MALAGA

Grenada (full day with lunch included)

We will visit the Alhambra, whose translation from Arabic "The Red One" refers to the sun-dried bricks used to build the outer walls. Together with Córdoba's Mezquita, this true wonder of Moorish art stands as one of the most prestigious testimonies of the seven-century Muslim presence in Spain. Next, we'll visit the Palacio de Generalife, the former summer palace of the Nasrid rulers, and its marvellous gardens designed in the 14th century.

TANGER

Chefchaouen (full day with lunch included)

Nestled high up in the Rif Mountains, Chefchaouen is unquestionably one of the most beautiful Moroccan towns. You'll discover historic monuments such as the Grand Mosque (exterior views only).

CASABLANCA

Casablanca (morning)

This young and dynamic city is a must-see for anyone wanting to get a true feel for the country. Among the sites we'll visit are Mohammed V Square—a worthy representative of Moroccan Art Deco architecture — the Court House, Central Post Office, and the Wilaya Building. Afterwards, we'll visit the Hassan II Mosque, one of the largest mosques

in the world and among the rare religious buildings in Morocco open to the public.

Rabat (afternoon)

The coastal town of Rabat is one of four Imperial Cities of Morocco, with a rich historical past. Its medina, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2012, contains awe-inspiring monuments such as the Chellah medieval fortified necropolis, Hassan Tower, and the Mausoleum Mohammed V, which we'll visit.

AGADIR

Marrakesh (full day with lunch included)

An Imperial City and the capital of the mid-southwestern region of Marrakesh-Safi, Marrakesh has a particularly dense history. The minaret of the emblematic Kutubiyya Mosque, the largest in the city, overlooks the busy metropolis. Our walk will take us to Jemaa el-Fnaa, a square located at the heart of the medina, which offers an intoxicating array of colors and smells at the souk. We'll enjoy an authentic Moroccan lunch at a restaurant. Afterwards, we'll visit Bahia Palace, whose architecture reflects both Andalusian and Moorish influences. We'll then discover the delightful Jardin Majorelle, one of the most phenomenal botanical gardens in Morocco. Although initially destined to be destroyed in favour of the construction of brand new hotels, Yves Saint Laurent and Pierre Bergé purchased the garden in 1980.

MARRAKESH

Taroudant and Tiout (full day with lunch included)

Discover authentic Morocco as we travel through the Anti-Atlas Mountains. Located at the heart of the Souss Valley and surrounded by the High Atlas and Anti-Atlas mountain ranges, Taroudant is one of the country's most fascinating tourist destinations. The city, known as the "Grandmother of Marrakesh," abounds with souks offering treasures by local craftspeople. We'll take a tour of the ramparts for an occasion to gaze at the impressive city gates. We'll continue our trip by heading to Tiout. Enjoy a traditional lunch at a local restaurant (no alcohol served). Afterwards, you'll be free to take a stroll through the Tiout palm grove at the foot of the casbah. Also referred to as an oasis, it overflows with orange and pomegranate trees, date palms, and large carob shrubs. Lastly, we'll stop off at a cooperative where we'll learn all about the impressive properties of argan oil.

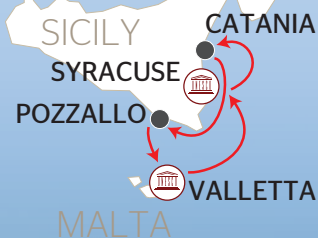

MOUNT ETNA

CATANIA

Catania (morning)

Located on the banks of the Ionian Sea and dominated by Mount Etna, you'll discover vast squares, wide streets, and lava-rock buildings in this splendid city. Its historic and artistic heritage is just waiting to be discovered.

OR

Mount Etna (morning)

Mount Etna is the largest active volcano in Europe, and we'll take you up to almost 6,400 feet (1950 m) to the Silvestri Craters near the top. The bleak lava wilderness around the summit of Etna is one of the most memorable landscapes you'll ever see.

RAGUSE

POZZALLO

Ragusa and Modica (morning)

Travel back in timewhen visiting these lovely UNESCO World Heritage sites. In Regusa, you'll discover two cities in one: modern Regusa rebuilt after the 1693 earthquake and ancient Hybla Heraia, the ancient Ragusa. The city's architectural gem is the Duomo of San Giorgio with its friezes, volutes and column fascies. We'll then continue on to Modica, a charming inland village snuggled on a hillside. Rebuilt after the 1693 earthquake, Modica is now a lively and dynamic city with oversized churches and steep stairs running from the bottom of the village to the top of the slope; and with houses in a thousand shades of ochre, interwoven with each other, crammed into the hills, in the lower town as well as the upper town. During our tour, we'll stop at a chocolate factory to taste a recipe coming directly from the Aztecs.

VALLETTA

Valetta (morning)

The splendid Maltese capital deserves a special visit. Perched on top of a steep cliff, its layout and architectural structures are remarkable. The city was built stone-by-stone by and for the Order of Knights of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem. We'll make an exclusive stop at Saint John's Co-Cathedral.

Discovering Gozo (full day with lunch included)

We'll set out on a full day trip to a calm, heavenly oasis on the Gozo. We'll take the ferry from Cirkewwa to Gozo, admiring the gorgeous landscapes and scenery along the way, including the impressive, fortified citadel in the capital city of Rabat. You'll discover remains of the Azure Window, a 92-feet (28 m) limestone natural arch that collapsed completely in March 2017, as well as the bay of Xlendi. In the afternoon, we'll visit the megalithic temple complex of Ggantija, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



Mdina and Rabat (morning)

Mdina is a veritable open-air museum. The ancient Maltese capital holds many treasures, among them several of the most beautiful homes in the country. You'll step back in time strolling through the labyrinth of streets lined with impressive palaces. We'll then head to Rabat, with archaeological relics testifying to the town's importance during the Roman period. We'll visit Saint Paul's and Saint Agatha's Catacombs, the earliest and largest archaeological evidence of Christianity in Malta.



Malta's treasures (afternoon)

Discover Malta's treasures by visiting the island's most beautiful sites. We'll visit the Hagar Qim temple complex, dating back to the beginning of the Bronze Age. Our next stop will be Marsaxlokk, a traditional fishing village. Its isolated location and deep waters have made it a strategic island location over the centuries.



SYRACUSE

Syracuse and Ortygia (morning)

One of the most fascinating cities in Sicily awaits us today. The 2,700-year-old city of Syracuse played a key role in ancient times, when it was one of the major powers of the Mediterranean world. We'll discover the unique site of the Necropolis of Pantalica, and visit Ortygia, the small island which is the historical center of the city. You'll come across the majestic ruins of the Greek Temple of Apollo, the Piazza Archimede, and the Piazza Duomo, an elliptical open space lined with harmonious and impressive buildings.

Noto (afternoon)

Noto and its church were declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2002. Totally destroyed by the 1693 Sicilian earthquake, the current town was built on the left bank of River Asinaro, about 8 miles from the previous town. Enjoy a stroll through the historical centre and admire the many monuments: the imposing church of San Francesco (outside), Palazzo Ducezio (outside), the cathedral and Palazzo Nicolaci di Villadorata (outside).

La Dolce Vita along the Italian coastline Naples, the Amalfi coast, the Aeolian Islands and Sicily

This trip will let you discover superb landscapes, picturesque towns and fascinating volcanic islands.

Departing from vibrant Naples, you'll begin a journey along the Amalfi Coast, with its towering cliffs, colorful villages and exceptional panoramas. Then you'll sail through the Aeolian Islands, a unique volcanic archipelago off the north coast of Sicily, revealing ancient remains and panoramic views of the Ionian Sea.

Get ready to be seduced by the charm of Naples, amazed by the beauty of the Amalfi Coast, impressed by the Aeolian archipelago and captivated by the treasures of Sicily.

NAPLES

Pompeii (morning)

A city frozen in time, which through its tragedy has become one of the most significant resources of information on Roman art, customs, trades, and life.

OR

Herculaneum (morning)

Just like Pompeii, Herculaneum was also destroyed by the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 AD. Discover the wealth of archaeological finds, from ancient advertisements and stylish mosaics to carbonized furniture and inhabitants.



Naples (afternoon)

Discover the must-see sites, masterful works, and unexpected treasures in Naples, such as its old town and royal palace. In the oldest section of Naples, enjoy a stroll down the Via San Gregorio Armeno, the famous pedestrian street where you can observe skilled craftsmen actually working on nativity figures as they carve and paint them. During the holidays, the atmosphere here becomes enchanted. We'll visit the Cloister of Santa Chiara to admire the nativity scene with 18th century figurines.

OR

The Museo di Capodimonte (afternoon)

One of the most beautiful Italian art galleries. The former palace, built in the 18th century, holds the city's art collection, including Caravaggio's Flagellation of Christ. Afterwards, a panoramic tour of the city of Naples.

Capri and Anacapri (full day with lunch included)

We'll take an airboat to splendid Capri. On arrival, we'll head to the village of Anacapri and visit the Villa San Michele, built at the turn of the last century by Swedish physician and author Axel Munthe. From the villa gardens, you'll have a fantastic view of the city of Capri, the Gulf of Naples, and Mount Vesuvius. In addition to the amazing backdrop, the gardens themselves possess a rare beauty. Enjoy some time on your own this afternoon or visit the Gardens of Augustus, located on the top of a cliff with a stupendous view of the turquoise sea.

MESSINA

Mount Etna and Taormina (full day with lunch included)

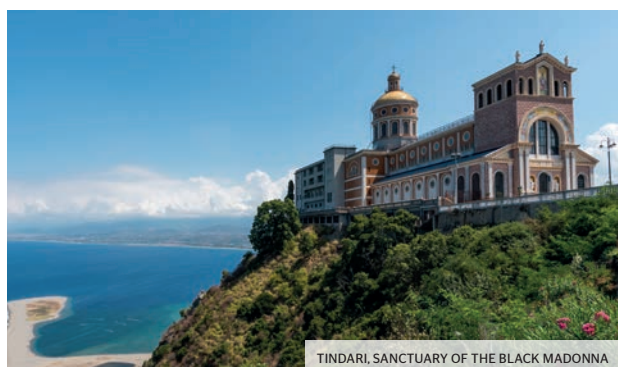
Mount Etna is the largest active volcano in Europe, and we'll take you up to almost 6,400 feet (1950 m) to the Silvestri Craters near the top. The bleak lava wilderness around the summit of Etna is one of the most memorable landscapes you'll ever see. We'll then drive to Taormina. Nestled above the stunning Sicilian coastline, Taormina brings to life the legendary beauty of Sicily. Enjoy a tour of the area, including the ruins of its ancient Greek theater.

OR

Mount Etna and wine tasting (full day with lunch included)

We'll set out to visit one of the most famous volcanoes in Europe. Century after century, the eruptions have modified the slopes of the mountain, forming unique sculptures of lava and ice. Our coach will climb the mountain to the Sapienza refuge, at about 6,234 feet high (1,900 m). From there, we'll continue our ascent by aerial tram and then in a four-wheel drive bus to the "Tower of the Philosopher." From the ancient and monumental Valle de Bove caldera, you'll take in the superb view across the valley to the Mediterranean Sea.

MILAZZO (SICILY)

Tindari (afternoon)

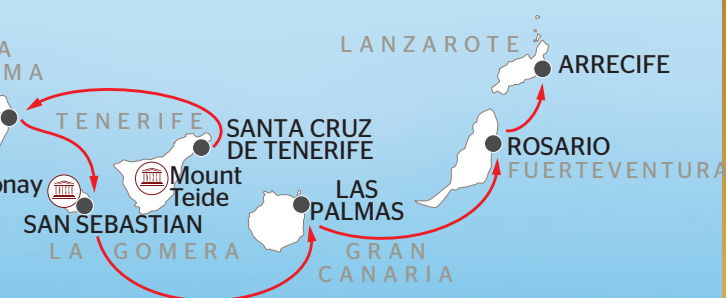

SANTA CRUZ DE TENERIFE (TENERIFE)

Teide National Park (morning)

It sits at an altitude between 5,413 ft. and 12,198 ft (1,650 m and 3,718 m) and gives a great opportunity to visit a dormant volcano and its surroundings. The park was created in 1954 to preserve and study the volcanic structures and forms represented in the almost 74 square miles it covers (189 km²). You'll experience an astonishing view from the top of the crater, and you will be able to stroll around a bit to experience it all from different angles.

Puerto de la Cruz (afternoon)

Discover this seaside resort and its picturesque old town as you meander along the waterfront and down charming streets lined with gardens, beautiful homes, and quaint churches. We'll stop at the Mirador de Humbolt, a lookout point with sweeping views of the Orotava Valley and its banana plantations. We will then visit the Orchid Garden Sitio Litre, home to the most extensive collection of orchids on the island.



SANTA CRUZ DE LA PALMA (LA PALMA)

In the heart of the island of La Palma (afternoon)

We'll visit the Santuario de Nuestra Señora de Las Nieves, a lovely white washed sanctuary housing the venerated Virgin of the Snows. Our tour will then take us along mountain roads and through extraordinary scenery to the Caldera de Taburiente. We'll stop at a traditional 17th century farm, surrounded by gorgeous gardens and breathtaking views. On the way back, a brief stop at the Mirador de la Concepcion overlook will give you an impressive view of the coast and northern part of the island.

GARAJONAY NATIONAL PARK

SAN SEBASTIAN (LA GOMERA)

La Gomera island tour (afternoon)

We'll visit Garajonay National Park, which is blanketed with thick, bay-tree forests. This UNESCO World Heritage Site offers a striking contrast to the rest of the archipelago. We'll pass through the quaint villages of Hermigua, Las Rosas, and Agulo—whose sweet charm led to the nickname "The Bonbon of La Gomera". We'll stop for a typical island tea time and listen to a demonstration of Silbo Gomero, the whistled language used by the islanders. We'll enter Garajonay National Park to see the Roque Agando rock formation, the symbol of the island, jutting far above the greenery of the forests.



BETANCURIA

ROSARIO (FUERTEVENTURA)

The Secrets of Fuerteventura (morning)

We'll begin towards the northern part of the island at the Finca Torres, where we'll discover how local goat cheese is made. At the end of our tour, we'll enjoy a tasting of this famous delicacy. We'll then continue on to the small village of Tiscamanita to visit a cosmetics producer who uses aloe vera, one of the most prominent crops on the island. You'll learn everything you'll need to know about this surprising plant. Lastly, we'll experience Betancuria, the island's first colony and former capital. French explorer Jean de Béthencourt founded Betancuria at the beginning of the 15th century. He chose the area within the valley to be protected from pirate attacks. Despite his strategy, pirates razed the village in 1593.



LAS PALMAS, OLD TOWN

LAS PALMAS (GRAN CANARIA)

Las Palmas and the Bandama Caldera (morning)

We'll begin in old-time Vegueta and the Casa de Colon, a colonial-style mansion with exhibits about the history of the Canary Islands and their link with the New World. We'll continue on to the Bandama Caldera, a volcanic crater that reaches 1,867 feet above sea level (569 m).

Teror and the Garden of La Marquesa de Arucas (afternoon)

Teror is a place of pilgrimage for all the island's inhabitants as it houses the statue of the patron saint of the island in its basilica, the Virgen del Pino. We'll see the outside of the imposing, black cathedral and visit the lovely Garden of La Marquesa de Arucas, home to 400 species of tropical and subtropical plants.



TIMANFAYA NATIONAL PARK

ARRECIFE (LANZAROTE)

Timanfaya National Park (morning)

Seventy-five percent of the island's surface is covered with craters and lava flows dating back to massive volcanic eruptions 270 years ago. We'll travel to the Fire Mountains in Timanfaya National Park to experience this singular beauty. We'll also take part in geothermic demonstrations at the Islote de Hilario. The next stop will be the Salinas de Janubio, salt flats created in a natural lagoon. We'll enjoy a tasting of wine and cheese at one of the oldest bodegas on the island.

Learn about César Manrique (afternoon)

One of the most important artists in the Canary Islands. He was a painter, architect, builder, and sculptor. He was also an ecologist and activist for sustainable development in the local construction industry. Jameos del Agua is the art, culture, and tourism center where his talents can be experienced firsthand. Afterwards, we'll head to the Mirador del Rio to take in the outstanding views of the moon-like landscape. Lastly, we'll visit the César Manrique House Museum.

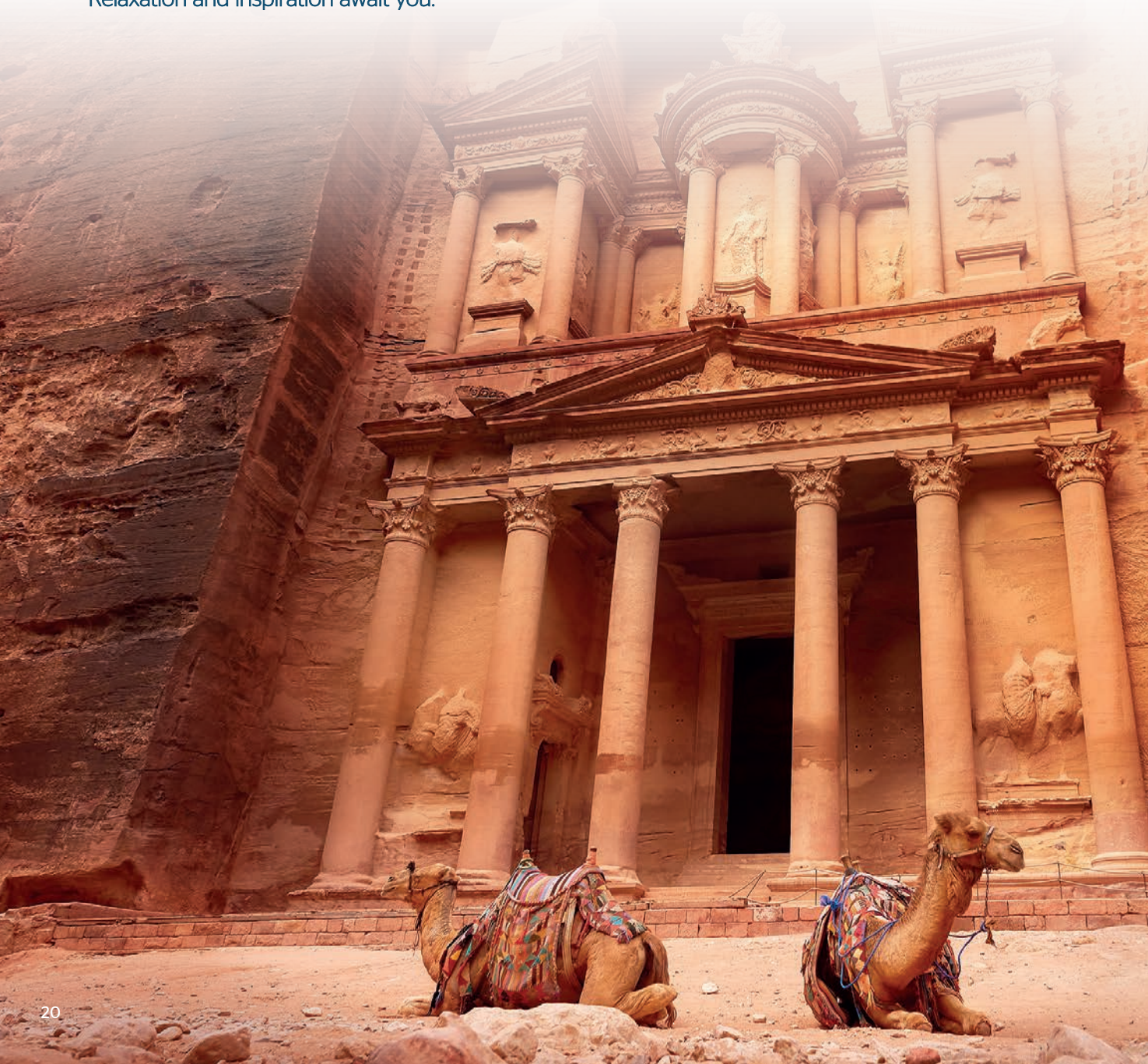

We'll leave for Thebes, the ancient capital of the Pharaohs. It's one of ancient Egypt's top tourist destinations. Symbol of the kingdom of the dead and classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Valley of the Kings contains the tombs of the greatest pharaohs: Amenhotep II, Ramses XI and Tutankhamun. Not all of the 62 tombs carved out of the mountain are open to the public, but you can visit three of them, including the tomb of Seti Ist, the largest and best-preserved tomb in the Valley of the Kings. Farther along, dominating the eastern bank, sits the 59-foot high (18 m) Colossi of Memnon—faceless effigies seated on thrones at the entrance to the mortuary temple of Amenhotep III. We'll also visit the Karnak Temple Complex. At the heart of this site stands the colossal Precinct of Amun, containing a sacred lake.

MONASTERY OF SAINT CATHERINE

NUWEIBA⁽³⁾

Monastery of Saint Catherine⁽²⁾ (full day including lunch length approx. 9h incl. 5h return trip)

You will cross the Sinai, a mythical area that is part of a major episode in the Bible, symbolised by a landmark, a sacred mountain that gave it its name, and whose resonance is universal. According to the Bible, it was on this mountain in Egypt that Moses met God. You will visit the monastery of Saint Catherine, located at the foot of Mount Sinai, the oldest Greek Orthodox monastery in the world. The guided tour will take you through the basilica and the chapel of the Burning Bush.



WADI RUM

The Wadi Rum desert (morning)

Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site, we'll set out in Jeeps to cross the magnificent desert, also known as the Valley of the Moon. Its vibrant red earth and stunning rock formations make it one of Jordan's most extraordinary sites. Geologists think that Wadi Rum was formed from a strong push from underground, which caused a large fissure in the surface. Some wind-brushed mountain peaks reach over 6,000 feet. Deep canyons and sand dunes add to the mystique. For many centuries, the freshwater springs attracted trade caravans travelling between Arabia, Syria and Palestine. Today, a few hundred Bedouins still call the area home. Known for their hospitality, it is under their tents that you will enjoy tea and sweet specialities.



PETRA, THE "SIQ"

AQABA

Petra (full day including lunch length approx. 10h incl. 4h return trip)

Petra is unquestionably one of the greatest marvels ever sculpted by Mother Nature and enhanced by humankind and is considered one of Jordan's national treasures. Carved into the pink and red stone by the Nabataeans—an Arab people living in Jordan over 2,000 years ago—Petra, meaning "rock" in Greek, was strategically located at the junction of the silk and spice trade routes. To enter the city, we will follow the "siq" a narrow gorge approximately a half-mile in length, delimited by sharp cliffs on either side—ending at Al Khazneh, also known as "The Treasury": This tomb of a Nabataean has an impressive Hellenistic facade carved directly into the pink stone at the beginning of the 1st century, it is a masterpiece of refinement and symmetry which, on its own, makes a visit to Petra worthwhile. We'll also discover the Roman-style Nabataean theater carved into the rock over 2,000 years ago.

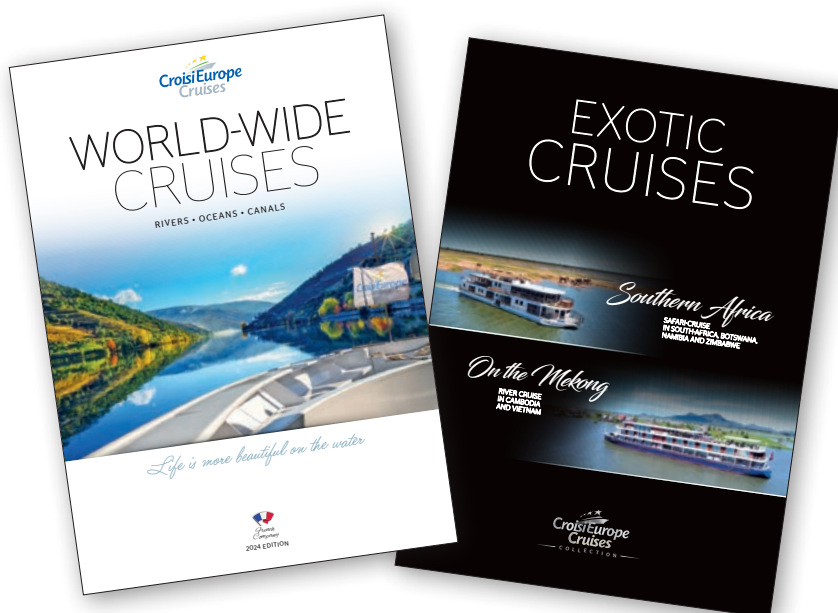


GIZA PYRAMID COMPLEX

CAIRO (PRE-PROGRAM)

Following the footsteps of the Pharaohs (full day with lunch included in the program)

We'll begin in Saqqara, a huge area that served as the burial ground for Egypt's ancient capital, Memphis. The main monuments, such as the Step Pyramid, are located in Zoser's funerary complex. In the afternoon, we'll visit the world-famous Giza pyramid complex and the Great Sphinx, who watches faithfully over the ancient structures. Abou al-Hôl, literally the "Father of Terror" in Arabic, was called Sphinx by the Greeks because he resembled the mythical winged monster, who, according to legend, guarded the Greek city of Thebes, asking a riddle to travelers seeking entry into the city, and killing those who were unable to answer. We'll then visit the Egyptian Museum, the oldest archaeological museum in the Middle East, which covers over 5,000 years of history in the area and includes the largest collection of Pharaonic antiquities in the world.



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
